We are supported by a small but excellent patient group but expanding the patient voice remains crucially important to us and the researchers with whom we work. An ethics committee has reviewed and approved the survey and by clicking on the link and completing the survey you consent to the Wales Cancer Biobank collecting the data you provide when answering the questions.

Cardiff University (as WCB's host institution) will be the data controller under the General Data Protection Regulation and all responses will be kept securely in line with the Data Protection Act 2018.
