

WCB Digital: transforming cancer research in **Wales** 

The Wales Cancer Biobank Digital (WCB Digital) project is helping cancer research across Wales by creating a fully integrated system for accessing samples and genomic data. This national collaboration brings together the Wales Cancer Biobank, Genomics Partnership Wales, Wales Gene Park, AWMGS, and Cardiff University's ARCCA team to

Led by Liz Merrifield and Peter Giles, WCB Digital supports the Genomics Delivery Plan for Wales and CReSt strategies by establishing a unique pathway that links NHS data, including patient samples, genomic profiles, diagnostic results, and treatment

A key innovation is WCB's new eConsent platform, enabling paperless, clinic-based consent with automatic data integration. This sustainable, patient-focussed approach has already attracted international interest and is shaping future models for biobanking. With ongoing input from patients and NHS partners, WCB is exploring


